

Childhood Immunisation Training for registered Nurses

Immunisation is one of the most effective activities health professionals undertake. It protects the individual, prevents epidemics and can eliminate some diseases. Thanks to immunisation, many of the infectious diseases once seen in Britain have now been eradicated, however every lapse in uptake brings renewed potential for infection.

Changes to the immunisation schedule, the need to provide clear, evidence-based communication on the benefits of vaccination, the known side effects of vaccines and the safety and efficacy of vaccines demand that those immunising are fully prepared and updated for their role.

This programme has been developed for registered Nurses working in primary care to enable them to implement vaccination programmes effectively.

This programme is based in a Clinical governance framework of PCT and Practice protocol as promoted by HPA National Minimum Standards for Immunisation Training & Core Curriculum for Immunisation Training, guidance of professional bodies and the Department of Health ‘Immunisation against infectious disease’ 2006 (‘Green Book’) CMO update letters and DH Training Slides.

- Documentation, record keeping and reporting
- Strategies for improving uptake rates
- New developments
- Personal and professional development
